



During a special ceremony held at the President's Office this afternoon, Dr. Mausoom accepted the letter of appointment extended by President Solih. Prior to his recent appointment, Dr. Mausoom served as the High Commissioner of Maldives to Singapore.

Having filled various roles in the government including Minister of Tourism Minister, Deputy Minister of Tourism and Civil

Aviation, Minister of Environment, Energy and Water in the former President Maumoon Abdul Gayyoom's regime, Dr. Mausoom acquired immense experience in the industry. He had further led the board of Maldives Association of Tourism Industry (MATI) following the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami crisis.

In the 2009, Dr. Mausoom represented Haa Alif Kelaas as a Member of Parliament while also working as a senior member of Maldives Tourism Promotion Board. His tourism related experiences also includes serving as the General Manager of the renowned Sun Island Resort.

Hailing from a respected background, Dr. Mausoom completed his Master of Science in Hotel and Catering from the University of Ulster, UK and secured his doctorate in Philosophy in Urban and Regional Studies from the University of Birmingham, UK. He was the first Maldivian to attain a PhD in tourism development.

During the absence of the Tourism Minister, Minister of Economic Development Uz. Fayyaz Ismail oversaw the Ministry of Tourism as the acting head.

The revised mandate includes researching and collecting scientific data and specimens with regards to sea life and the marine environment; ensuring more on sustainability, protection in threat of extinction and ensuring fishing mechanisms to protect the marine environment with effective eco-system strategies in the Maldives.

Moreover, MMRI is mandated with research work and providing expert opinion on developing aquaculture profession in the Maldives, with factual information partaking international associations.

Maldives Immigration Introduces Traveller Health Declaration

Amidst the reopening of Maldivian borders on July 15, 2020, Maldives Immigration has introduced "Traveller Health Declaration" to expedite the process of pre-arrival and pre-departure health information in accordance with the health requirements of the Maldives. All travellers travelling to and from Maldives are required to submit a self-declarative health declaration within 24 hours prior to their travel under this declaration.

Traveller Health Declaration has to be filled and submitted via the online portal of Maldives Immigration, "Imuga", imuga.immigration.gov.mv. It can also be viewed by visiting the official website of Maldives Immigration,

All the travellers, including tourists, work visa and other visa holders, and Maldivians have to submit the Traveller Health Declaration. According to the government office, the main objective is to mitigate health risks and ease immigration procedures.



Maldives Resilient Reefs Campaign #FishForTomorrow Earns Public Support for Protection of Vulnerable Species



#FishForTomorrow campaign, led by the Maldives Resilient Reefs project by the Blue Marine Foundation, has secured public support for the protection of giant groupers and all species of parrotfish in the Maldives.

Over 27,000 people – more than five per cent of the population – responded to the campaign's online polls. 78% of Maldivians said that they would now release a juvenile grouper or snapper if they caught one. 85% said they would release a berried lobster, which is a national law. 78% of people said they believe #FishForTomorrow has helped them better understand reef marine life,

and 70% supported the legal protection of giant groupers and parrotfish. Maldives Resilient Reefs project - Riyaz Jauharee stated: "Parrotfish are one of the most important groups of fish on coral reefs. Overfishing of them has devastated reefs in many countries and those reefs have never fully recovered. The Maldives must act now and ban fishing of Parrotfish before it is too late. "

#FishForTomorrow was developed in response to the emergence of photographs displaying illegal fishing in the Maldives of nationally protected giant clams and the

unsustainable capture of other important species such as parrotfish. Healthy populations of such fish on coral reefs are crucial for the Maldives' fight against climate change. The campaign's aim was to familiarize and educate the Maldivian people about the biology of particularly vulnerable reef species in order to ensure they understand why some species can be easily overfished and require such careful management. Maldives Resilient Reefs used interesting facts about local fish species, such as "Red snappers can live up to 55 years - longer than a bear!", to shock people into changing their perceptions about fish.

Throughout the four-week campaign, nearly 40,000 people – just under 10% of the Maldivian population – visited the website and played the campaign's "higher or lower" game where players were required to guess the answers to questions like, "Which of these species can you legally fish?". The campaign also kick-started a viral trend for fishermen to post Instagram Stories of themselves releasing juvenile groupers and snappers.

The campaign was supported by variety of "reef hero" advocates and influencers including popular local band Detune, as well as Ahmed Saeed (Gahaa), Riyaz Jauharee and Shaziya Saeed (Saaxu). Find out more about vulnerable species from www.fishfortomorrow.maldivesresilientreefs.com.
